



What's the Buzz?



To enhance the safety and security of both students and staff, Lovin has a system which requires visitors to be “buzzed” into the school. Once the school day begins, our doors will be locked and visitors will need to bring a photo ID and press the bell button to gain entry to the school. The bell button is located on the brick column to the right of the main door. Upon entering the school, please sign in to receive a visitor’s badge. When ready to leave, please exit the school building through the main entrance and officially check out.

Attendance

The responsibility of school attendance is that of both parents and students and is governed by the State of Georgia Compulsory Attendance Law. Please refer to both the GCPS website and the Gwinnett County Public Schools 2019-20 Elementary School Student/Parent Handbook for detailed information on GCPS policies and procedures regarding school attendance. **Students must attend school for at least the equivalent of half the school day in order to be counted present.**



For each absence, a written excuse should be sent to your child’s teacher on the day your child returns to school. If a parent note or third party excuse is not turned in, the absence will be regarded as unexcused. For your convenience, **a printable absence excuse note is available in the Forms & Flyers section of our website** at LovinES.org/home.html. Documentation should be submitted within 5 days of the student’s return to school.

A list of possible interventions for students with unexcused absences, tardies, and/or excessive early check-outs can be found in the GCPS Handbook or by contacting a school counselor. Parents can review their child’s attendance at any time by logging in to the Parent Portal.

Checking In Late

Student Hours: 8:15 a.m. – 2:45 p.m.

Instruction begins promptly at 8:15 a.m. **Students cannot be dropped off prior to 7:45 a.m.** as there is not be adequate supervision. Those who participate in the breakfast program should report directly to the cafeteria. The cafeteria closes at 8:10 and **students must be in their homeroom by 8:15 am to be considered on time.**

Entering a classroom after 8:15 a.m. causes a disruption to the learning environment. **Any student arriving to class after 8:15 is considered tardy and the child’s parent/guardian is required to escort their child to the front lobby of the school to sign in and receive a late pass. Arriving after 11:30 is considered a full day absence.**

Checking Out Early

Anyone checking out a child must do so **no later than 2:15 pm.** **Check-outs should be reserved for emergency circumstances and cannot be used as a student’s regular means of dismissal.** For security reasons, anyone checking out a student must be on the list of persons authorized to do so, and **will be required to show a picture ID.** (Adding someone to the list of persons authorized to check out your child cannot be done over the phone. For security purposes, changes **MUST** be done in writing.) Teachers are ***not permitted*** to release students from the classroom. Your cooperation is appreciated, as this is a safeguard for all our students.

NOTE: Students who accumulate an excessive number of late check-ins or early check-outs may become ineligible to receive perfect attendance awards.

Cafeteria

Our cafeteria offers a nutritious breakfast and lunch each day with a variety of entrees and side dishes from which to choose. Breakfast and lunch menus are posted on our website. **In order to participate in the breakfast program, students must arrive between 7:45 a.m. and 8:00 a.m.** Student meal prices are the same as last year and are listed below.

A variety of ice cream is also sold during lunch for \$1.00. Students must pay for ice cream with cash.

Meal Accounts: Although breakfast and lunch can be purchased on a cash basis, we encourage you to open an account through MyPaymentsPlus™. You can deposit funds in your child's account with a debit or credit card, or you can have funds deducted from your checking account. It's a free service, it's very easy, and the best part is that it will send you an email when the balance in your child's meal account falls below the amount you specify. See page 8 for more information or visit mypaymentsplus.com. To create an account, you will need your child's nine-digit student ID number. If you need assistance with your account, MyPaymentsPlus can be reached at 1-877-237-0946.

Lunch Charges: Please keep money on your child's account. Negative balances are discouraged. Students charging a meal will be given a reminder note to go home to parents informing them of their current account status and the need for immediate payment. Charges beyond \$11.25 are not permitted. Once payment is made, outstanding charges will be deducted from the payment with the remaining balance made available for future meal purchases. Complete procedures governing lunch charges can be found on the GCPS website. **A la carte items and breakfast charges are not permitted.**

Free or Reduced Meals: Free or reduced breakfast and lunch will be provided for those students whose families meet federal guidelines. **Parents or guardians must submit a new application each year** and can apply via the secure, online application form available at gwinnett.school lunchapp.com. When you submit your online form, please make sure you receive a confirmation number. You should receive a confirmation email in 24 to 48 hours. If not, you will need your confirmation number to find out the status of your application. Printed applications are also available at the school, but these applications may take up to 10 days to process. **Students must purchase lunch or bring lunch from home until approved, and IF approved, charges are NOT retroactive; Therefore, parents are responsible for any charges incurred in the interim.** If you have any questions, please contact the Free and Reduced Help Line at 678-301-6307. You will need your child's student ID number.

Cafeteria (continued)

Lunch Guests: Parents and other guests are welcome to join their child for lunch. The cost for an adult lunch is \$3.00. In keeping with our school wellness initiatives, we request that parents not bring fast food. Please bring your ID, sign in at the front lobby desk, obtain a visitor's badge, and sit with your child at the designated guest area. Because space is limited, students cannot invite a friend to join them.

****A special request for parents of kindergartners:** Because kindergartners are busy learning lots of new routines and procedures at the beginning of the school year, we respectfully request that parents of these students wait until after Labor Day to plan their first visit.

If a student brings a lunch to school from home, the lunch must not contain carbonated beverages in cans, nor should they bring items that require use of a microwave or heating. Students should bring food in non-breakable containers that they can open easily on their own. Please note that fast food cannot be brought in.

Change of Address or Phone

In case of an emergency, **it is imperative that we have current working phone numbers for parents or guardians**, and at least two additional local contacts in the event you cannot be reached. Please notify the school in writing if there are changes to your address, phone numbers, email, or emergency contacts.



Clinic (Phone: 678-518-6944)

The clinic is run by a trained adult and NOT a registered nurse. First aid will be administered in the clinic, but medication, whether over the counter or prescription, can only be given if a parent or guardian has completed an Administration of Medication Request form (available in the Forms & Flyers section of our home page). Medications must be in the original container and must be housed in the clinic. **No child should have any medication in his or her possession.** The parent or guardian must deliver all medication (including over-the-counter medications) to the clinic. **Medication cannot be kept in the classroom or transported by the child.**

A parent will be called if a student is too sick to remain at school, has been seriously injured, or is running a temperature of 99.6 degrees or more. **It is critical that the school have current phone numbers in the event of an emergency.** Per GCPS policy, students with the following symptoms must be kept home until the symptoms are absent for a full 24 hours without the aid of medication: Diarrhea (2 or more loose stools in a 24 hour period), vomiting, and/or fever of 100.0°F or above. Students with pink eye or strep throat should also be kept home until they are on antibiotics for a full 24 hours. **It is important to keep your child at home if he/she is sick. Please notify the school if your child has been diagnosed with an illness that could affect the health of others.**

Clubs & Extracurricular Activities

Lovin offers a variety of before and after school clubs. Some clubs are open to students in specific grade levels or those who meet eligibility criteria. For a complete list of clubs and extracurricular activities offered including meeting days and times, please see **Clubs & Activities** in the **For Students** section of our website at LovinES.org/home.html.

Communication

Communicating effectively with parents is a priority at Lovin. Details on “**How We Connect**” can be found on the inside front cover. The Parent Portal is the best way to check on your child's academic progress. Be sure to opt-in to messages from SchoolMessenger (see page 9) as this is one of the main ways we communicate.

Counseling Department

Our school counselors provide classroom guidance lessons to all students, focusing on the areas of academic, career, and life skills development. They also provide small group counseling, individual counseling, and consultative services as needed. The counseling office can be reached at 678-518-6966.

Dress Code

Students are encouraged to dress appropriately at school. GCPS policy states, "Prohibited dress shall include any attire that depicts, promotes, or advertises gang affiliation, illegal activity, illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco, sexual references, offensive words or designs, and other clothing which is disruptive to the learning environment." The wearing of short shorts or skirts, halter tops, spaghetti straps, and sagging pants are not considered appropriate dress for school, and we ask that our students not wear them. With the exception of designated "hat days," hats should be removed before entering the building. Students may be asked to change their clothes to meet appropriate dress code protocol. Repeat offenses may result in a discipline referral.



Electronic Devices / Cell Phones / BYOD

Lovin Elementary is a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) school. Although devices such as cell phones, iPods, etc. are not prohibited at school, we do not recommend that students bring these items on campus unless being used for instructional purposes. Items should not be visible during the school day and use of these devices could result in disciplinary action. Devices that disrupt the learning environment will be held in the front office for parent pick up. **The school is not responsible for lost or damaged devices.**

Homework

Home study is a necessary part of each student's educational program. The need increases as a student progresses into higher grade levels. Parents are strongly encouraged to check their child's agenda book and/or eCLASS page each day and set aside a daily time for their child to complete homework assignments. If your child has no current assignments, the time can be used for reading.

Insurance

Student Health and Accident Insurance is offered as an option and service to interested families. For enrollment, benefits and cost information, visit www.kandkinsurance.com or call 1-855-742-3135.

Library Books and Textbooks

Library books and textbooks are loaned to students and should be treated as borrowed property. If books are lost or damaged, parents must pay for the book(s) in accordance with a scale set by the State Department of Education and/or the local Board of Education. Parents can log in to the Parent Portal to see what book(s) have been loaned to their child.



Lost and Found

Students can turn in found items or check for a lost item each day **before school**. Check with the front office for the location. Note that items of value such as eyeglasses, house keys, cell phones, etc. are kept in the front office. At the end of each semester, any unclaimed items will be donated to a local charitable organization. In order to reduce the number of lost articles, please label articles of clothing and lunch boxes.

Moment of Silence

The General Assembly of Georgia enacted a law requiring a Moment of Quiet Reflection at the opening of school each day. We will have a quiet time for sixty seconds in each classroom during the morning announcements following the Pledge of Allegiance.

MY eCLASS / Parent Portal



Both MY eCLASS (student portal) and the Parent Portal serve as valuable resources for information about your child's academic assignments and progress. Both can be accessed from the GCPS home page at gwinnett.k12.ga.us or from Lovin's homepage at LovinES.org/home.html. Be sure to log in often!

MyPaymentsPlus

Opening an account at MyPaymentsPlus.com is mandatory for GCPS parents as it allows you to electronically sign all the required beginning-of-the-year forms. (A credit card is not required to sign forms.) Through MyPaymentsPlus, you can add money to your children's account throughout the year to pay for such things as meals, contributions to the clinic, PTA membership, headphones for the computer lab, yearbook, field trips, special event tickets and more. It's an easy-to-use, efficient way to make payments quickly and securely anytime using a simple Internet connection or by downloading the MPP app on your phone. You can say goodbye to the hassles of sending in multiple checks to multiple locations for multiple students - and it will send you an email reminder when your child's balance drops below the level you choose! To create an account, you will need your child's nine-digit student ID number. If you need assistance with your account, MyPaymentsPlus can be reached at 1-877-237-0946 or visit mypaymentsplus.com/support.

Parties/Birthday Celebrations

Classes are allowed to have a maximum of two parties per year (winter/spring).

We realize birthdays are special occasions and we enjoy celebrating with a small treat. However, please help us keep students on schedule and distractions to a minimum by saving drinks, balloons, flowers, party favors, etc. for the "real" birthday party. Parents may deliver a simple treat to the school office on their child's birthday, provided it arrives prior to your child's lunch time. Treats will be served only in the cafeteria during lunch, **must be store bought**, and should be pre-cut or in individual servings such as cookies or cupcakes. Many parents choose the easy option of purchasing ice cream for the class through our cafeteria for \$1.00 each. Please note that invitations to birthday parties cannot be distributed at school unless every child in the class receives one or if the party is gender-specific (i.e., all girls in the class (or all boys) are invited.)

Physical Education (PE)



Your child will attend PE twice each week and will participate in a multitude of physical activities. Please check the weekly Specials schedule (communicated by your child's teacher and also available in the *Forms & Flyers* section of our home page) to ensure your child is dressed appropriately on the days he or she has PE. Non-restrictive athletic-type clothing should be worn (no skirts/dresses), and **athletic** shoes are a requirement. **Because students may go outdoors for PE and recess, please ensure they are dressed appropriately for the weather. A note from a parent or doctor is also necessary for a student to be excused from participating in P.E.**

PTA

Lovin has an active and dedicated PTA and many ways in which parents and extended family members can become part of the Lovin family. Volunteers get to enjoy interacting with the children, become friends with other parents, and accomplish things that truly make a difference. SchoolMessenger

SchoolMessenger is a rapid notification system used to contact families in Gwinnett County Public Schools via telephone messages, text messages, and email messages. The district uses the system to communicate information related to districtwide events, including safety alerts, key school dates, and school closings due to inclement weather. Schools use the system to communicate information related to school events as well as automated attendance messages. 
Student Discipline

We believe every child can learn in a positive climate that includes fair, firm, and consistent practices. We believe that all students have the right to feel safe and the right to learn. Therefore, we adhere to the GCPS Student Conduct Behavior Code as outlined in the GCPS Student/Parent Handbook. Please review and discuss with your child.

PBIS - Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports

Lovin follows the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) program supported by the Georgia Department of Education and Gwinnett County Public Schools to promote and maximize academic achievement and behavioral competence. PBIS encompasses school-wide strategies for helping all students achieve important social and learning goals. We know that when good behavior and engaging teaching come together, students will excel in their learning.

7-Step Student Support Plan

We believe in reinforcing positive behaviors by giving students the opportunity to earn Tiger Tokens. Ask your child for details!

The purpose of the 7-Step Student Support Plan is to help consistently manage classroom disruptions. It allows the focus to stay on teaching and learning. Students who reach the 7th step on the support plan will be referred to the Student Support Team and may receive further disciplinary action. Students who violate a major GCPS rule may receive a discipline referral.

Telephone Messages

Messages to Teachers

Calls are received by the school between 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Instructional times cannot be interrupted for incoming calls. You are welcome to leave a message for teachers to return your call. Remember that emails sent to teachers might not be checked until after students have been dismissed or the following day.

Messages to Students

Please remember that our purpose is to provide an excellent learning environment. Only messages of an emergency nature can be delivered to students. Use of the phone by students is permitted only in emergency situations.



Transportation

****IMPORTANT: You must choose ONE main mode of afternoon transportation for your child. Any time a student's mode of transportation changes, the school must be notified in writing. Please do not rely on emails to teachers, as they may not have the chance to check messages prior to dismissal. For safety reasons, we cannot accept transportation changes over the phone. Bus passes cannot be issued for play dates, birthdays, Girl/Boy Scouts, sleepovers, or any other reason except an emergency as determined by a school official. Bus passes are valid for up to 10 consecutive days.**

BUS RIDERS

Students riding a bus will be expected to ride their designated bus and enter and exit at their designated stop. Students annually receive instruction in safe riding procedures. Bus drivers share guidelines and safety procedures beginning the first day of school, with monthly reviews to enhance the safety of children being transported. Each bus driver has complete charge of pupils riding the bus. Students who refuse to obey the school bus safety guidelines shall forfeit the privilege of riding the bus. Please review the Bus Safety Procedures which can be found in the GCPS Elementary School Student/Parent Handbook.



CAR RIDERS



If your child will be a car rider, you must obtain a car rider number from the front office. This number must be visible to staff who are assisting with loading. Under no circumstances are staff members permitted to release a child to anyone without a number. If you have misplaced your number, please come to the front office to receive a replacement.

****Pulling all the way to the front of the loading area and as close as possible to the car in front of you will allow us to load and unload more cars at one time and will get you to work or home that much faster! Our priority is keeping students safe. Thank you for your cooperation and patience as students are loaded and unloaded from cars.****

Drivers must remain with their vehicle at all times and are not permitted to park and walk students across the lines of traffic, pass other cars in the car rider line, or enter the bus lanes at any time buses are present. We request that you not use your cell phone while in the car rider lane. Lovin also supports Georgia's Clean Air Campaign and we ask that you **turn off your engine** to protect our environment and our children's lungs.

PLEASE NOTE: All car riders MUST use the car rider line between 7:45 and 8:15 am. Drop off in the front of the school is not be permitted unless a child arrives after 8:15 am. A parent must come inside to sign them in.

DAY CARE TRANSPORTATION



Students using day care transportation must have a Transportation Parent Authorization form on file and also a Verification of Day Care Enrollment signed by your day care provider. If your child normally takes day care transportation, and he or she is absent or you need to change those arrangements at any time, **please inform both the day care provider and the school.**

EARLY RELEASE TRANSPORTATION

Early release days occur during scheduled parent teacher conference days in October and February and may also occur if inclement weather moves into the area. When students are dismissed early, we follow your child's regular transportation plan unless we have received different instructions from you **IN ADVANCE** and **IN WRITING**.

Visitors and Volunteers

We would like all of our parents to feel free to visit our school. For safety reasons, all parents and visitors must show a photo ID, utilize the check in system in the front lobby, and wear a visitor's badge while on school property. Visits should be pre-arranged with the teacher or administration. During these visits the regular school program must continue. **Visits should take place in the classroom and not on the playground. Please limit your visit to 30 minutes** so that teachers can maximize instructional time with all students. A prior appointment should be made for observations or conferences.

Please contact your child's teacher or Lovin's Parent Center if you are interested in volunteering during the school day. Because teachers cannot stop instruction to direct those who show up unexpectedly, volunteers must schedule their visit to the classroom so teachers will have the opportunity to prepare materials and organize student groups ahead of time. **Volunteers are not permitted to bring non-school age children with them to school.** We welcome all volunteers and there are numerous ways you can become involved such as helping in the computer labs, copy room, classrooms, media center, and various other activities.
